In this activity, the objective is to practice making requests, and also to practise responding to them.

9 Making Dialogue

In pairs, first, make a dialogue from the following report of the conversation, and then do a role play.

1. You've gone to a department store to exchange a watch. You explain to the sales assistant that you think your father won't like it and ask if you can exchange it.
2. The assistant says yes, she'll exchange it for you, and asks you when you bought it.
3. Last week, you answer. Then you observe that buying gifts for other people is often a difficult business.
4. The assistant agrees, and invites you to look at a tray of watches. Then she asks why you think your father won't like the watch you'd bought.
5. You reply that you had thought about it, and had decided that he wouldn't like the style – it looked like a young man's watch.
6. The assistant picks one out and asks what you think of it.
7. You say you like it, but the price seems a little expensive. Does she have anything in the same style, but cheaper.
8. The assistant picks another one out and asks what you think of it.
9. You say you like it and you'll take it.
10. The assistant says that because it's a little bit dearer than the other one, that will be 15,000 won extra.
